Introduction

MOSAI started All India Japanese Language Speech Contest in 1985.

First round of Contests (Zonal Contests) are held in North, South, East and West Zones and final All India in New Delhi.

Speech Contest is meant to encourage students to express spontaneously their own thoughts in Japanese Language. It is not a memory test of a written speech. All participants receive certificates. The first, second and third prizewinners in each category are also given special prizes.

Students can participate either in the junior or in the senior category depending upon their level of training in the language (details are given under rules and regulations). Candidate has to be nominated by the organization where she/he is learning Japanese Language. Students desirous of participation may contact the Institution where they are studying Japanese.

Rules, Regulations and Application form are given below

Rules & Regulations

1. General Rules

The nominating institutions should be teaching Japanese Language either as part of a University, College or a private organization.

If Japanese Language is being taught at a private organization, the organization must be registered under an appropriate Act of the Government. Registration can be as 'Not for Profit' organization, Trust, Society, Company etc.

Private institutions/organizations will have to provide registration details (for example registration number of their organization).

The nominated candidate must satisfy the Eligibility conditions given below.

An authorized person of the nominating institution must certify fulfillment of conditions.

MOSAI reserves the right to reject application that is not complete in all respects.

In case the undertaking is found to be incorrect the institution may be debarred from sending candidates to the contest.

2. Eligibility:

The following eligibility criteria apply: at the zonal contests held in different parts of the country and for final All India contest

2.1 At the time of the Zonal contest the candidate must be an authorized student of a recognized or registered institution (as defined above) where Japanese Language is taught.

2.2 Not Eligible Contestants

The following students are not eligible to apply

- Student who has studied Japanese Language for more than 1500 hours or for a total period spread over 5 years or more.
- Student who has studied in Japan for more than 3 months.

- Student who has been or is engaged in the teaching Japanese language **in any institution.**
- Student whose parents' or either, wife, husband, mother or father's native language is Japanese.

2.3 Minimum & Maximum Age: Minimum is **18** and maximum is **35**.

3. The Senior and Junior Group Criterion:

- Senior Group:

Any eligible candidate (as defined in 2 above) can take part in the senior group.

- Junior Group:

Only those eligible candidates (as defined in 2 above) who have studied Japanese Language for less than or equal to 500 (Five Hundred) hours as certified by the nominating Japanese Language Teaching Institution can apply to participate in the Junior Category.

4. Conditions on First Prize Winners of earlier All India Contest

- The first prizewinner of a particular year, in either category, cannot participate in the next year's contest.
- The first prizewinner in the junior category shall not be allowed to participate in the senior category of the contest held next year. However, such candidates are eligible to participate in the subsequent years i.e. after a one-year gap.

5. The Speech and its Content:

- Candidate can speak on any subject of her/his choice other than politics and religion.
- Duration of speech should not exceed four minutes.
- The content should reflect personal views /thinking and familiarity with the topic.
- The speaker should not reveal her/his name or of the nominating institution in the speech.

- Any candidate who is appearing again (second time) is not allowed to repeat the earlier topic.
- The level of language (vocabulary and idiomatic usage) of the speech should correspond to the contestant's Japanese language training. (The level of language used will reveal if the candidate is expressing her/his own thoughts spontaneously or from a pre-memorized speech)
- The contestant should not read from a script while delivering the speech.

6. Evaluation:

6.1 Evaluation Procedure

Speech will be followed by a question answer session of about two minutes. Questions will be asked by language experts and will relate to the level and content of the delivered speech.

A panel of Judges consisting of prominent Japanese residents and experts will evaluate the performance of each participant and their decision will be final.

6.2 Evaluation Parameters

Some of the parameters taken into account in judging the performance include:

- Content should reflect personal thinking and familiarity
- Grammar and pronunciation
- Vocabulary and Language suitable to the level (junior/senior)
- Delivery etiquette, attitude and pronunciation
- Response to the questions (questions will relate to the delivered speech)

7. How many can participate from One Institution

1. Zonal Japanese Language Speech Contest:

An Institution can nominate maximum 2 candidates per Group (2 in Senior and 2 in Junior). The Japanese Language teaching institution may select the candidates it wishes to nominate for participating in the zonal contest directly or through any other pre-contest within the institute.

2. All India (National) Japanese Language Speech Contest:

Winner of 1st 2nd & 3rd in Senior and Junior Category from each zone.
